

Year 4 Spring 2 Homework – What Did The Romans Do For Us?

Our topic this term is about the Romans in Britain. The homework suggestions on the next page are just that – suggestions.

Your child may discover something during research that sparks their interest and they might want to create something I haven't thought of.

Ideas:

- Create a Roman A-Z roadmap using their road system
- Make a clay model of an artefact they saw at the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology
- Recreate a model of a Roman villa uncovered in Britain
- Make a model of a bathhouse
- Write a brochure for the Baths at Bath (Aquae Sulis)
- Design of poster of the Top Ten Roman Technologies
- Research what inventions and technology the Romans introduced to Britain and explain with a PowerPoint presentation what life would be like without those
- Make a model of a Celtic settlement
- Factfile of – Roman life / Army and Weapons / Famous Romans, etc

There is no end to the possibilities. The homework should be something your child is interested in.

They will also be asked to present their homework to the class. This should include:

- what the homework is
- why they chose that homework
- how they researched or made it
- something they learned from it
- something interesting to tell the audience
