	2	Settlement locations	Settlers look for places with access to food, shelter and water. Places with electricity, farmland, defence, health care and transport links are more appealing to settlers. Essential, desired and unwanted facilities and features can be used to explain people's choices. Which of these did Cambridge have?					
Ĭ	3	Establishment of Cambridge	Early Cambridge had access to water, flat land for growing food, a hill for protection, materials for shelter and fuel. The bridge made it an attractive place to live. Modern Cambridge has many facilities, businesses, attractions and the University to appeal to people.					
	4	Places that are important to us	Use an atlas (including the index) to locate the towns, cities and countries that our class has links to.					
	5	Maps	Land use can be identified on a map by the names of buildings. Houses are usually easy to spot on maps, as they are lined up in rows. A school name would suggest an area is residential. Industrial buildings are much larger than houses, and are usually grey or white.
